



Evangelism

Since we have started the Revitalization process here at Redeemer, I have been asking other Winona pastors many questions about what is going on at their churches especially concerning evangelism. Evangelism is reaching out to the community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Here is what I have learned – nothing scientific about my conclusions.

- 1. The very few churches in Winona that are growing are doing so because of trans fers* and not conversions. Two growing church pastors in Winona told me they had very, very few conversions. One indicated it had been three years since the last conversion. Most pastors of declining churches indicated that people were just dropping out and were not going to any church.
- 2. Another question I asked the pastors was, "Who does evangelism in your church?" I got two responses, "I'm it" and "No one." That probably explains why most churches are not growing.

Here is what recent studies have found:

93-94% of churches are not effectively evangelistic.

Churches have lost their intentionality in evangelism.

Evangelism is falling off the radar for many churches.

A growing church is not necessarily an evangelistic church.

I believe that Redeemer is at the crossroads. Now is the time for us to decide whether we will (1) close or (2) move forward in a mighty way. Which will it be? I have heard members predict that we will be closing in two years, five years or ten years. If we continue to do nothing in terms of outreach, I believe those predictions. Redeemer will close. However, I believe the Re:Vitality** process can move us forward in a mighty way. We will need to make some adjustments to move forward and we will need to focus our time and resources into being a "outreach" church instead of an "inreach" church. Be on the lookout for my report "A Vision for Redeemer" in the month of August.

* Definition: Transfer means people joining Church A when they were formerly a member at Church B. Conversion is when a person goes from non-Christian to Christian.

** Definition: Revitality is not bringing life to a dead church, but amplifying the life of a living church.


