The New Normal on Church Guests

Recently I participated in a webinar from Lifeway Research on the subject of church guests. The speaker made it clear that the traditional type of visitor is almost a thing of the past. The traditional visitor is someone who is loyal to his or her denomination. If he or she moves they will seek out that denomination in the new town and most likely join that church. This type of visitor or guest is labeled as the “old” normal. This type of visitor has pretty well disappeared.

The “new” normal guests fall into three categories.

1) Experimentals – these are largely people who have no church background but have started to seek out a church. They generally have high expectations of the churches they visit. The churches generally get one chance to make a good first impression. A negative first impression means they will not come back for a second visit. The examples used for a negative first impression were one rude person, poor child care, and dirty bathrooms. Twenty percent of church guests fit into this category according to Lifeway Research.

2) Life Changers – these are people who are seeking out a church because of a major life change such as birth of child, death in the family, job change, finances, illness. With this group the church has a small window of opportunity. Once the crisis has passed the window closes.

3) The Relationals – The research found that 8 out of 10 people would go to church if they were “invited and accompanied” by someone who belongs to the church. So if you invite and bring a friend or neighbor to church they will come! This group has the highest percentage of second visits because they already have a connection to the church through the person who brought them to church. These are the people who are most likely to join a church.

Our Re:Vitality Committee has been talking about and coming up with ideas on how we can make our building and our congregation more guest friendly.

The webinar recommended good hospitality (greeting, tours, bathrooms (again!), refreshments. That the website should be guest friendly. If you haven’t checked out our new website, do so. (Thank you, Jason Passow) Child care, pre-registration on the website, safety issues especially for children, guest friendly signage on and in the building, and (wait for it) “over-the-top” bathrooms.

Things to ponder. Share your ideas and thoughts with me.



Gift Opportunities

Appreciated Stock or Mutual Funds

If you have any appreciated stock or mutual funds, you can benefit tremendously by gifting the appreciated asset directly to Redeemer. Redeemer does not pay capital gains taxes. You, as the donor, get the opportunity to deduct the value of the stock on the date you give it to Redeemer. Redeemer has an account at Edward Jones located at 1215 Gilmore, Winona MN (507) 454-5068 to accept this type of donation.

Here is a sample of how this can work: *Jim wants to give \$5,000 to Trinity. If he gives cash and is in the 28% bracket, his out of pocket cost is \$3,600. If he gives stock worth \$5,000, but he paid \$4,000 for the stock, his out of pocket cost is \$4,000 minus \$1,400 or \$2,600 to give \$5,000 in value. Plus, he avoids \$150 in cap gains tax. So the gift costs \$2,450.*

IRAs

The Federal Government made permanent the law that allows donors age 70 1/2 and older to withdraw up to \$100,000 each year from the total of all their IRA accounts tax-free if they give the money directly to a charity. Any distribution to charity counts towards the donor's required minimum distribution from their IRA accounts even though the charity, and not the donor, is the recipient.

Giving through an IRA is very simple too. You don't need an attorney. Simply call your IRA administrator and tell them what you want to do.

Life Insurance

One of the easiest ways to make a gift to Redeemer Lutheran Church is through life insurance. Simply, you can make the church a full or partial beneficiary of a life insurance policy that you own or intend to take out.

Wills

A will simply directs those we leave behind how to divide up what is left. It is a statement of what was important to you. It can be a final way to teach your kids that they were important to you, but so were some ministries that are making a difference in the world. Contact your attorney to make a will or to add a codicil to your will to include Redeemer Lutheran Church.

Gifts through a person's estate are lasting testimony to the importance that the church and service to God has held in someone's life.

Planned Giving

Other opportunities to give include Charitable gift annuities or charitable trusts. These are set up with a professional.

Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.
