

PRAY EVERY DAY

Acts 4:31, "And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness." (ESV)

Come March 3 there will be a different pastor in the pulpit of Redeemer. The change of pastors is always a difficult time for congregations. What should you do? The answer is: pray!

As you see in Acts 4:31, great things happened when the church prayed. Prayer was a huge part of the early church. When Peter and John were arrested after the healing of the lame man in the temple, the church prayed. When they prayed, God demonstrated that their prayer had been heard.

When Peter and John were released from jail, they joined other Christian friends in Jerusalem. While Acts doesn't record it, those friends were probably praying for the release of Peter and John. What did Peter and John do when they were released? They prayed.

The presence and the power of God the Holy Spirit were with them. What dramatic results! With prayer something will happen. God may deny your request but grant you what is better for you. Like the story of the theologian, Augustine. He wanted to go to Italy but his mother was worried and prayed that he would not go. He did go to Italy and there he was converted to Christianity. Technically, his mother's prayer was not answered but ultimately it was – just not the way she expected.

When a church prays, something happens. It is for God and it is for good. So pray every day!

My last Sunday will be February 24. I will be in office until the end of February getting things ready for the vacancy pastor and to ensure a smooth transition. In addition, I will be moving my personal items out.
