





The Poinsettia

Have you ever wondered what made the poinsettia so special? A native plant to South America, the poinsettia blooms during the winter; a sign of life among death. The bold red color of the leaves are used to naturally dye clothing, and the sap is used to treat fevers. Beware that this plant is toxic to animals if ingested.

Poinsettias were first introduced in America in the 1820's by a botanist who was visiting South America and fell in love with the bold colors. He transplanted some to America and entered them into a flower show where they have been a popular winter flower since.

The Christian symbolism of the poinsettia comes to us from a small girl in Mexico. According to legend, a small Mexican girl was upset because she had nothing to bring the baby Jesus during Christmas service. Her family encouraged her, saying that anything she brought to Jesus would be more than enough because our love for Him is what he really cares about. So the girl picked some weeds and fancied them up as best she could. After placing them in the manger, they transformed into beautiful poinsettias!

The star shape is meant to symbolize the Star of Bethlehem that shone brightly over the barn where Jesus was born. The red leaves symbolize Jesus' blood that he shed for our sins, and if you find a white poinsettia, it stands for Jesus' purity.


