The Day that *Really* Changed the World

Ask people what day they think changed the world, and you will get all sorts of answers. An older person might say December 7, 1941, when Japan bombed Pearl Harbor. Or when the USA dropped two atomic bombs in 1945. A radio broadcaster claimed that September 11, 2001, was the day that changed our world.

What was the day that changed our world? The day that *really* changed the world was the day that Jesus was raised from the dead, when Jesus came out of the tomb.

There were no news reporters, no lights, and no cameras. A news anchor didn't suddenly flash on the screen. There were no interviews on all the talk shows. Life didn't come to a screeching halt. Governments were not called into emergency session. There were no shockwaves that reverberated around the world as they did on September 11. No, Resurrection Day was not an international event like September 11, but it changed the world forever.

Yet unlike September 11 or other historic days, many do not believe that Jesus rose from the dead. The idea of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ has been relegated to the world of mythology right up there with Homer's Iliad and The Odyssey. Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny, and the Resurrection of Jesus Christ are just fairy tales.

Skepticism about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is nothing new. There were scoffers in Paul's day just like today. In 1 Corinthians 15:1–11, Paul boldly declares that the Resurrection is the gospel truth! He tells us how we know it is the gospel truth. Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 and see that the resurrection of Jesus *is* the day the *really* changed the world.

Happy April! It's hard to believe that we only have two months of school left. We've got lots to squeeze in before the end of the school year. Coming up this month is Dads and Donuts, one of our favorite events. Dads can hang out at preschool and enjoy donuts with the children.

We wish you all a glorious Easter!




In this article, congregation members pose questions to M.C. (our Music Coordinator) who thus responds with whatever words of wisdom the Lord chooses to give him.

Plate offerings from the Lenten midweek services are designated to the Winona Warming Center. The Winona Warming Center provides temporary emergency shelter for the adult, 18 and over, homeless population of Winona County and is located at the Community Bible Church on 69 E. Third St. in downtown Winona. This project is the work of concerned community members and Catholic Charities. Community Bible Church have agreed to provide the place for this shelter with supervised by volunteers.

People using the shelter will be given a safe, warm overnight place to sleep, nutritious snacks, opportunities to shower, and laundry facilities. The Center is open from 9 p.m. to 7 a.m. through March.

The Winona Community Warming Center works with the Winona Police, Winona County Community Services and Winona Health to help meet the needs of their guests. Information on resources is be available to guests. On certain dates, volunteers will be available to help with requested referrals and forms.



CHOCOLATE STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE

Heart Healthy Recipe: No one will know this decadent dessert recipe—rich chocolate shortcake filled with a fresh raspberry sauce—has less than 150 calories per serving. This healthy chocolate recipe is romantic, delicious and low calorie.

Shortcakes

2 Tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 cup whole wheat flour

2 Tbsp granulated sugar

3/4 tsp baking powder

1/4 tsp baking soda

1/8 tsp salt

2 Tbsp cold reduced-calorie, trans fat free margarine, cut into bits

1/4 cup skim evaporated milk

Raspberry Sauce and Topping

1 1/2 cups raspberries1 tsp granulated sugar3 Tbsp low-fat vanilla yogurt1/4 tsp confectioners sugarMint sprigs, for garnish

Preparation

For the shortcakes: Preheat oven to 425°. Lightly coat a baking sheet with nonstick cooking spray. Into a bowl, sift together cocoa powder, flours, sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Add margarine, and blend the mixture until it resembles coarse meal.

Add evaporated milk and stir mixture with a fork until it forms a dough.

Divide the dough in half, arrange each half in a mound on baking sheet, and bake for 10 minutes, or until a tester inserted in the centers comes out with crumbs clinging to it.

Transfer the shortcakes to a rack and let them cool.

For the raspberry sauce: In a bowl, mash 3/4 cup of the raspberries with a fork. Add sugar and stir until sugar is dissolved. Gently stir in the remaining 3/4 cup raspberries.


Assemble the shortcakes: Cut the shortcakes in half horizontally. Top each bottom half with half the rasp-berry mixture and 1 1/2 tablespoons yogurt.

Top with the top half of a shortcake. Sprinkle shortcakes with confectioners sugar and garnish with mint sprigs, if desired.

Yield: 2 servings
